Discipleship



To ensure the widest participation possible, we moved our meeting place to church and meet after each First Sunday Community meal! The Men's Life Group started the year with the study entitled The Prodigal Son, The Long Walk Home, by Matt Carter. This study is helping us to discover the fullness of life in the love of the Father. We are currently using the study Daniel – Faithful in the Fire. This study is helping us live out our

faith regardless of the challenges that we face in our culture.

We had wonderful game nights filled with laughter and friendly competition and also enjoyed a night out at the Maryland Theater

Connecting with each other and the world around us

We have created amazing ways to connect and minister to many more people. We have given people options to stay home if they are sick or are away from the area but still stay connected. There are many options for people to be part of the Vine community. We are currently reaching an average of 59 people each week who engage with The Vine Church in person and on-line!



Our year began with collecting breakfast items for the REACH Cold Weather Shelter on a monthly basis from January through the beginning of April. Each month Lori Sewell and Sheri Fraley would deliver our breakfast items to support those who seek shelter from the cold weather.

The Ladies Tuesday for Tea fellowship group started the year with a wonderful gathering at Pam's house, it was a time of fun,


Throughout the year, we supported the Tabitha's Table Food Bank each month. Our support helped them to purchase over 1,000 pounds of food to distribute to those in the community who are experiencing food insecurity.

The Vine provides support to those living in our building on a monthly basis by ensuring their water bills do not increase. We subsidize the water bills for each resident in our building. We also support the BIC world missionaries on a monthly basis through our regular tithing.

Once again, the Vine church had a world wide impact by sending 40 infant care kits to places such as Malawi and Sudan supporting new mothers in the care of their new babies. We also provided immediate support and supplies to the Ashville, NC community that was devastated by Hurricane Helen causing post-apocalyptic damage, taking the lives of over 100 people.



In April, we sponsored the Movie Ordinary Angels at the Waynesboro Theatre. The



Smithsburg Days brought yet another time we engaged our community. We raised funds for our benevolence fund

through the sale of yard sale items and making snow cones for donations. It was a wonderful success as we had many conversations and invited many people to connect with The Vine!

During the year, our Vine community continued to distribute homeless compassion bags to people who are living on the streets or in camps. Our bags included items such as shirts, socks, gloves, hats, water, food items, Bibles, and street guides with information about where they can go to get many needed services such as shelter, food and health care and employment.





As a Vine community, we went to the streets to pray. We proclaimed the name of Jesus over our community, our town hall, fire department, police department, schools and over all the residents. Praying for others is one of the most caring ways we reach people with the love of Christ.

Gathering around the table has became a cherished tradition for our Vine family. We have had many great conversations around the table, whether it is in our church, playing board games, or

eating at a pool party! Spending time with each other is the hallmark of a healthy and growing congregation.

As a Vine family, we are committed to help everyone grow and experience the love of Christ in their lives and in their families' lives!

It is such a pleasure to see how Jesus is blessing our families and changing hearts to serve our Lord and each other!





Our annual Roxbury camping trip was an enjoyable time together as we relaxed and enjoyed the beauty of nature and time with the Lord and each other. Our focus was on the

sanctity of life and how we are all cherished in God's eyes. During this time together we had the opportunity to show our love for others by assembling 40 infant care kits to be distributed by the Mennonite Central Committee to such places as Malawi and the Sudan. We began collecting supplies in July and continued collecting supplies for the infant care kits until our time at Roxbury.

Once again, we continued our emphasis on caring for the community with our door to door blanket and coat collection. We went door to door on Upper Edgemont Rd and Apple Grove Ct. in Waynesboro, PA. It was an extremely successful day as we collected 45 blankets and 63 coats for a total of 108 items. The coats included children's, women's and men's coats that were distributed to people in Waynesboro and Hagerstown shelters.

Our congregation also provided 10 Christmas meal boxes to be distributed by Tabitha's Table for those in our community that are experiencing food insecurity.

We also adopted a family that was fleeing domestic violence to provide Christmas for a mother and four children. This family was being sheltered by CASA (Citizens Assisting and Sheltering the Abused) in Hagerstown, MD. It is amazing to care for others even in an anonymous manner to protect families' safety and security.

Our Vine Christmas party was a wonderful time that started with our morning worship service and Advent celebration, and concluded with wonderful food, great conversations, and fun times for everyone! It is a blessing to be a part of a loving and







Fiscally

As far as the numbers go, we must never lose sight of the fact that it is only the grace and mercy of Jesus that provides hope for our lives. This is His church, and we are the body to be led and directed by a loving and sovereign God! The detailed reporting can be found in the annual report.

We currently have a combined (in person and on-line) attendance of 57.

From a financial perspective, we continue to experience an outpouring of blessing even through the pandemic and beyond. We ended the year with a balance in our checking and savings account for a total of \$21,623.97. Our Benevolence balance is \$7,521.80 and is part of the total balance previously stated. The Benevolence Offering will assist us with caring for the community in practical and meaningful ways.

During this past year the Benevolence fund was used to support the Hurricane Helene victims in Ashville NC, provided support to Churches in Mission, provided funds to Tabitha's Table to provide for client's homeless prevention, supported people in our congregation, assisted with the Infant Care Kits and provided support to the New Hope Shelter for critical repairs.

We also increased our support to Tabitha's Table Food Bank each month and subsidize the water bills for all the tenants in our building. I am deeply grateful for your hearts and your commitment to The Vine family.

Our Christian witness must never be a private venture. We must intentionally go beyond our comfort zones and purposely engage our communities with the love of Christ and sharing our stories.

Together, as the body of Christ, we will create opportunities for people to engage with each other and the community around us. Together, the hope that Christ provides will never disappoint us but propel us to new horizons as the Vine community.
